Did you know?

Quest has been operating since 1993. It started as a Community Access Program offering daytime supports to 7 individuals in the Lethbridge area.

Note from Safety

The Health and Safety team has seen an influx in Near Miss/Hazard forms relating to an increase in interactions with the transient population. These reports have primarily been related to the AIR locations. In conversation with OH&S representatives this is a anticipated situation many individuals and businesses are facing due to the colder weather. As such, the following recommendations are provided for all employees and individuals to ensure safety in all areas of the city, with a focus on the AIR programs.

- Avoid Offering Money or Food: Providing food or resources may encourage individuals to return.
- Decline Requests for Help: Direct individuals to the nearest shelter. We aim to avoid setting a precedent for assistance on-site for individuals who are not supported by the Agency.
- Avoid Engagement: If transient, unknown individuals are loitering or encampments start to form, please call 311. If the safety of employees or individuals is at risk please contact the non-crisis/complaint line at the police station by dialing 403–328–4444; 311 is closed on weekends so a single call to the non-crisis/complaint line each day is appropriate.
- Employee Safety Protocol: If you feel threatened in the parking lot, prioritize your safety. Stay in your car or a secure area until it is safe to enter the AIR buildings or the location you are attending. Trust your instincts, and if someone appears aggressive or erratic, leave the area and call 911.
- Report: If you see a threat, report to management when safe to do so in order to notify any other supported individuals who may be in the area. When at AIR, ensure you report concerns directly to an AIR Team Leader or management. While at AIR any position has the authority to call a Lockdown when necessary. AIR must work in collaboration and call a lock-down for other programs if a situation warrants (e.g. an unknown person is aggressive in the parking lot; or; a known person might seek out recluse or attention from another program).
- Document: Please complete a Hazard/Near Miss form for any parking lot concerns that do not pertain to supported individuals (as this would be documented in an Incident Report).

AIR welcomed a Fire Prevention Officer to do two presentations at AIR, one at Impact and one at Reach; SAIL then went on a firehall tour where members checked out ambulances and fire trucks. What advice would you give to the new hires?


This employment might seem a little odd and confusing at times just never lose sight helping those we support.



We recently had the pleasure of hearing about an incredible trip taken by two of our community members, Mo and Larry, who visited the beautiful community of Kugaruuk, Nunavut, in December!

Kugaruuk, nestled on the shores of the Arctic Ocean, is renowned for its breathtaking landscapes, vibrant wildlife, and rich Inuit culture.

INTERVIEW WITH MO

What were you most prepared for?

I was mainly prepared for the weather! Everyone warned me about the extreme cold in Kugaaruk this time of year, which made me a bit anxious. I also packed some snacks to keep myself entertained during downtime.

Did you learn anything new about the culture that you hadn't known before?

During my visit, I noticed that when I went to certain places, I waited for someone to offer me a seat, but no one did. I quickly realized that it's not common practice for people to offer seats; instead, you just take your own. I was also surprised to see people eating raw frozen caribou. It was shocking at first, but they assured me it's healthy and doesn't cause stomach issues for them.

Did anything surprise you during your travels?

What stood out to me was the air transport system. It reminded me of a bus transit system. Our plane from Yellowknife made stops in Gjoa Haven to drop off and pick up passengers, and then continued to Kugaaruk. I was also struck by the high cost of living; it didn't seem to be a major concern for the locals, as they seemed to cope with it effortlessly. Just a heads-up-don't plan to visit Kugaaruk with a grocery budget from Lethbridge!

Did you see any wildlife during your stay?

I was really hoping to see a polar bear so I could have a great story to tell, but I didn't even spot a footprint!

Did You Know?

- It takes four different flights to reach Kugaaruk
- Kugaaruk was previously known as Pelly Bay
- The name Kugaaruk means "little stream"
